• **Program Completion Rate** (calculated annually) - The number of students who complete the program within a cohort compared to the number who enrolled in the cohort initially.

• **Credentialing Examination Pass Rate** (five-year average) - The number of graduates who pass the American Registry of Radiologic Technology (ARRT) or an unrestricted state licensing examination (Radiography, Radiation Therapy, and Magnetic Resonance) compared with the number of graduates who take the examination with six months of graduation.

• **Job Placement Rate** (five-year average) - The number of graduates employed in the radiologic sciences, within six months of graduation, compared to the number of graduates actively seeking employment in the radiologic sciences.
