Student Graduation Rates

The chart below indicates graduation rates for the 5 most recent cohort years. Each cohort is defined as first-time, full-time students entering in fall semester of the cohort year. Graduation rates are defined as the total number of individuals from a given cohort of full-time, first-time degree/certificate-seeking undergraduates who completed a degree or certificate within a given percent of normal time divided by the total number of students in the cohort. Graduation rates are calculated as a percentage of normal time to completion for the associated degree – e.g. a 2-year degree completed in 3 years would equate to a 150% completion rate.

Rates below are current as of the publication of the 2019 IPEDS data feedback report.
